Here are some questions for consideration as you read and provide comments for your partner's personal essay:

- 1. Is the topic interesting? Does the introductory paragraph whet your appetite for the rest of the essay?
- 2. Does the narration have a theme (or implied thesis)? Does the essay express a point rather than simply recount a story?
- 3. Does the narration focus on specific scenes? Does the writer pace the story effectively?
- 4. Does the narrator include vivid details to describe people, places, events?
- 5. Does the writer make himself a character in his own narration? How can he do so more effectively?
- 6. What do you like best about the essay?
- 7. Offer suggestions for improvement.

Writer: Review your partner's comments; devise a plan for revision. When you submit your revised draft, please complete the following questions in detail (I.E. by referring to specific lines):

- Did you stick with your original topic or did you change it along the way? Why?
- What problems did you encounter during the process of creating the essay?
- List two of the most important changes you made. Why did you make them?
- What part of your essay are you most proud of? Why?
